Ako in Team Uranga

Reading

This term, Team Uranga continues on its journey with Structured Literacy. This is an approach to teaching reading that is backed by the very best research into how children learn to read. Currently this is the best practice for all children to learn to read.

All children in Team Uranga have been making pleasing progress with this approach to literacy. At the Parent Teacher Conference, your child's teacher will talk about their learning and how you can support at home.

Maths

In Uranga, we have been learning about how numbers relate to each other. For example 7 is 1 less than 8 and 2 more than 5. It is 3 away from 10 and some of it's parts are 1 and 6, 2 and 5, 3 and 4. We can recognise dot patterns to 10 and are beginning to transfer this knowledge and understanding to work out simple addition and subtraction problems to 10. This term many of us will begin to explore numbers to 20 and learn more about place value, patterns, probability, shape and sharing objects to groups.



This term in week 8 and 9, we will have the Cantebury Life Education Trust van visiting with Harold. Harold will be teaching the Uranga children all about where their food comes from. There will be a charge for this visit added to Family Accounts by the office.



In Uranga we reward our children for showing our school values of Whanaungatanga, Manaakitanga and Ako.

At our Team huis we give out certificates to children who demonstrate our values and are good role models. We have a very special Values Award that we award to a child who consistently demonstates all 3 of our values. Congratulations to Levi Haydon HB1, Evie Gardner HB5, and Nelisa Layomagar HB6 who have received this award so far this year.




School Absences

Reminders

Some friendly reminders:

The doors to the yellow block open at 8.30am. It is important to have your child at school well before the 8.55am bell. This allows for them to connect with their teacher and friends. We do notice that children are more ready to start learning for the day if they have this time to connect before the day starts.

After school, teachers often have meetings in our block or are preparing for the next day. We ask that you please do not come into the block after school unless it is important.

Please do let your child's homebase teacher know if your child's pick up plan changes or if they are going home with someone different to usual.

Finally, it is important your child is picked up promptly at 3pm and that you let the school know if you are going to be late. If your child is not picked up by 3.10pm we will send them to the office and office staff will contact you.
